WHEREAS, The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and,

WHEREAS, The recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including, but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and,

WHEREAS, A resolution authorizing Allenhurst Borough to apply for such tonnage grants for calendar year 2016, will memorialize the commitment of Allenhurst to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Board of Commissioners to the efforts undertaken by the Borough and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and,

as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body; and,

WHEREAS, Such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the governing body no later than forty-five days after receipt of the annual audit, as per the regulations of the Local Finance Board; and,

WHEREAS, All members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with at least the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and,

WHEREAS, Failure to comply with the promulgations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 - to wit:

"R.S. 52:27BB-52 - "A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office."

ITEMS TO DISCUSS

The traffic light that was damaged last year was discussed. The Assistant Administrator presented two design options. It was decided to go with the design that looked most like the old light and pole.

The snack bar contract discussion was deferred to executive session.

The co-principal application for Larry Grunner was discussed and approved.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mrs. McGinnis discussed the wedding that was held at Mr. C's on Friday August 5th. She said it was very loud. She stated to have music till midnight is too late. She didn't call the police because she did not want to ruin someone's wedding. Donna Claus also stated she heard the music was very loud also. Mayor McLaughlin informed her the board would be discussing the situation in executive session. Mrs. McGinnis also stated that she asked her cabana boy to sweep her cabana, put up an umbrella and two chairs and open the cabana on the weekends. When she went down on Friday she thought it was a mess because there was sand in the cabana and her chairs were in a teepee in front of her cabana. Mayor McLaughlin explained that the cabana boys sweep the cabanas every morning but sometimes sand gets in when kids are running or playing by the cabana. He also told her that all the chairs are in a teepee because not everyone comes down every day and to open them all would not be efficient. He also asked if she tipped her cabana boy. Mrs. McGinnis replied she had in the beginning of the season. Mayor McLaughlin told Mrs. McGinnis that the board would be reviewing and working on the cabana attendant's responsibilities as people are expecting far too much from them.

Tim Moriarty stated that there was a race the past weekend and that they closed off Ocean Avenue. Mayor McLaughlin informed Mr. Moriarty that is was Deal's race. All of the race's that are run through Allenhurst are usually put on the Borough's website and an email blast is sent to residents.

Mark Horowitz asked about the dog park. Commissioner Bolan told Mr. Horowitz the Borough would be looking at it as part of their Park project. Mr. Horowitz also asked if the Borough had the data for the radar speed sign. Mayor McLaughlin stated he would talk to the chief and get back to him

Michelle Rogers stated that the stop signs on Page don't seem to work as people are not stopping and was wondering how the speed bumps worked. Mark Horowitz stated that they kind of work but mostly people speed then slow down and break when they get to the speed bump. She also asked about a traffic light on Corlies and Norwood. The Mayor stated that the county owns that road and they will be asking them again to do a study.

Mark Horowitz also stated that he is noticing a feral cat problem in the general areas of town. Mayor McLaughlin asked if he knew how many and if anyone was feeding them. Mr. Horowitz said he estimated about 10-15 cats but did not know who was feeding them. He also stated that if these cats start to have kittens it could become a problem. Mrs. McGinnis echoed her sentiments about the cats. Mr. Horowitz said that Eatontown was doing a pilot program to spay the cats. Lori Osborn, Borough Clerk stated that the Borough does not have a contract with the humane society to do this and it would be an added expense. Comm. Bolan asked the Assistant Administrator to look into the program that Eatontown is doing.

There being no further comments, public hearing was closed.

There being no further comments or any further business, the meeting adjourned to Executive Session. The meeting adjourned at 9:56 pm. Motion carried
