ORDINANCE #2022-13 - First Reading

ORDINANCE NO.: 2022-13 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ALLENHURST.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Allenhurst has determined that it is in the best interests of the community to revise the following sections of the Code of the Borough of Allenhurst to establish certain penalties to be payable upon conviction of violations thereof.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough of Allenhurst, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that the Borough Code of the Borough of Allenhurst be and is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

I. Chapter III, Section 3-7.1 "Penalties" be and is hereby revised by deleting the existing section A3-7.1" and replacing it with the following:

Penalties. Any person, firm, or corporation who shall violate any provision of the subsections 3-7 "Disorderly conduct" subsections a. through u. therein, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine as set forth below:

REPEALER. All other sections and subsections of Chapter III not specifically amended by this Ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect.

INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. All other Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency.

SEVERABILITY. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage as provided by law.
