# RESOLUTION #17 A RESOLUTION TO OPPOSE PROPOSED LEGISLATION

Offered By: Comm. McLoughlin Seconded By: Comm. Bolan

**WHEREAS**, The Honorable New Jersey State Senator Bob Smith, Chairman of the Senate Environment and Energy Committee, as primary sponsor, has introduced into the current session of the New Jersey State Senate Bill No. S2601 which, "Permits Fifth and Sixth Class Counties to assume control and responsibility for operation and maintenance of beaches bordering the Atlantic Ocean"; and,

**WHEREAS**, S2601 "would authorize counties of the Fifth and Sixth classes, (Atlantic, Monmouth, Ocean and Cape May counties) to assume the control and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the beaches that border the Atlantic Ocean within each county; and,

WHEREAS, S2601 authorizes a county to:

"establish a uniform beach fee and beach tag system within the county;

to establish a uniform policy with respect to beach improvement, maintenance and dune construction for the protection of properties near the beach.

to realize economies of scale by dealing with the maintenance and operation of all of the beaches within the county through one entity"; and,

**WHEREAS**, S2601 "requires the operation of the beaches (to) constitute a public entity of the county and the bill also provides counties that assume the control of beaches with an exception to the 2.5% cap on increases to final appropriations of the previous year for expenditures relating to the operation and maintenance of the county-controlled beaches; and,

**WHEREAS**, the operations of the beaches of the Borough of Allenhurst which S2601 proposes to place under the control of the Monmouth County Board of Freeholders has been and is at present under the control and responsibility of the citizens of the Borough of Allenhurst by way of their duly elected officials of the governing body exercise of office; and,

**WHEREAS**, Said operation of the beaches of the Borough of Allenhurst provides a high level of quality services through an equitable cost sharing between taxpayers and beach users which has kept the cost of beach operations in the Borough of Allenhurst affordable for all citizens of and visitors to the "Borough of Allenhurst; and.

WHEREAS, A shift of responsibility for and control of the beaches bordering the Atlantic Ocean from the local governing unit to the government of the County of Monmouth would have an immediate negative impact on both the taxpayers of the County of Monmouth and those who enjoy the beach in-so-far as the level of service at the current cost will not be able to be maintained with a county operation of the beaches; an increase in beach tag fees in the Borough of Allenhurst as costs for the operation/maintenance is assumed by uniform fee which on average will be higher than the current beach fees; and through an increase in county property tax as a result of the exception to the 2.5% cap on increases in final appropriations as the county government attempts to create and pay for an increased level of expenses in a time of reduced property values as a result of the economy and Superstorm Sandy;

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, That the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Allenhurst, County of Monmouth, find that they are categorically opposed to S2601 and respectfully request that S2601 be immediately removed from consideration by the esteemed boy of the New Jersey State Senate; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That a copy of this resolution be immediately transmitted to the Honorable Chris Christie, Governor; the Honorable Stephen Sweeney, NJ State Senate president, the Honorable Bob Smith, NJ State Senate, the 11<sup>th</sup> Legislative District, the Monmouth County Board of Freeholders and the New Jersey League of Municipalities.

### A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE CONTRACT FOR NEW WELL POINTS

Offered By: Comm. McLoughlin Seconded By: Comm. Bolan

**WHEREAS**, The well point system which provides water to the pool at the Allenhurst Beach was severely damaged by Superstorm Sandy; and,

**WHEREAS**, Prices were solicited from Burke Construction Co., the contractor who provided the original well points, and their recommendation is to install a proprietary system to which they hold a patent; and

**WHEREAS**, Said proprietary system is currently in operation at the Spring Lake Bath and Tennis Club and, after reviewing the specifications provided by Burke Construction, Co. as well as available alternatives, it is the Borough Engineer's recommendation that the Borough install the same proprietary system at the Allenhurst Beach Club; and,

WHEREAS, After careful consideration of the proposed proprietary system and available alternatives it is the recommendation of both the Public Works Supervisor and Beach Manager that the Borough install the superior product offered only by Burke Construction Co. as the same will require less maintenance and be more efficient; and

**WHEREAS**, in light of the proprietary nature of the superior system offered by Burke Construction Co., competitive bidding is not feasible; and

**WHEREAS**, the purchase of the proprietary system is permitted as an "extraordinary unspecifiable service" under N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5 in light of its proprietary and specialized nature, requiring expertise, extensive training and proven reputation in this particular field of endeavor; and,

**WHEREAS**, The Chief Finance Officer/Purchasing Agent has filed the proper certificate with the governing body which states that this is an extraordinary unspecifiable service; and,

**WHEREAS**, Funds are available for this purpose in Capital Ordinance #2013-02, known as Superstorm Sandy, and the Chief Finance Officer has so certified;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Borough of Allenhurst that the statements contained in the foregoing preamble be and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution as if more fully set forth herein at length; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** That a contract be awarded to Burke Construction Company for the following amounts for installation of a new well point system for the pool at the Allenhurst Beach Club:

### **PUBLIC HEARING**

Lori Osborn, Clerk-Administrator gave a status report on the projects at the beach.

Comm. McLoughlin talked about muni meters. He stated he asked the Chief and Captain to look into it. They suggested doing decals instead.

Comm. Bolan stated if they are going to do permit parking, they should include a portion of Main Street where all the commuters park.

Comm. McLoughlin added that money raised could be used for the parks.

Ed Dowling asked about enforcing the stop sign on Page. He asked if there was any feedback from the police and Mayor McLaughlin stated he spoke to the Chief twice. They are going to put signage up and they will have a special officer with a patrol car sit at the intersection to discourage motorists from running the stop sign.

Mr. Dowling then asked whether any current employees were offered management positions. He saw that two new people were hired as lifeguard managers.

Mr. Caron stated he has had several meetings with the two new employees. Their years of experience exceed everyone else.

Mr. Dowling asked if anyone else was considered for this position and Chris Rogers stated consideration was given to other employees. They looked at everyone's application. The two who applied for these positions had 22 years of experience and 15 years of experience.

Maryanne Dowling stated she spoke to Doug and he assured her that everything would be taken care of this year. She claimed the Borough was paying men more than women. Her daughter has

seven years of experience as a full-time lifeguard. She did not get a penny raise.

Mr. Caron stated that Mrs. Dowling's daughter did receive a raise.

Mr. Rogers stated that they dropped the salary on all part-time lifeguards.

Mrs. Dowling asked where all the money went; to the new guys?

Mr. Rogers stated that the two new guys will be making less per hour than what was paid last year.

Mr. Caron added that they will be putting hours in pre-season.

Comm. Bolan suggested they end the inquisition. This is not the way public comment needs to go. Obviously, the Dowlings think their daughter did not get enough of a raise or should have gotten a different position. The Beach Club managers went with somebody else. These are seasonal positions.

Mr. Dowling stated his daughter should have been given an opportunity out of courtesy.

Comm. Bolan stated that everyone knows Kathryn Dowling. The Managers found someone, who, in their judgment, would serve the position better. He cannot see where any decision was based on sex or gender.

Mrs. Varley asked when the Commissioners decided to change things to make Chris Rogers a manager or assistant manager. One of the persons from last year spoke to Doug or Chris and was told he had a job, but his job was filled without notice.

Mr. Caron stated he did reassure Rutledge that he had a job. He stated when Rutledge left last year, he told Doug that he would probably not be back because he did not make enough money. The time he was able to devote, just wasn't enough. He did an excellent job with the guards, but just didn't have enough time.

Comm. Bolan stated the Commissioners give Doug and Chris a lot of discretion with hiring. This is Doug's second full-time year at the Beach Club. There are some changes that are going to be made. This is not the forum to make Doug defend his decisions.

Mrs. Varley commented that a letter should have been written.

Comm. Bolan stated they are not writing letters to seasonal employees. There was a hurricane and everyone is extremely busy.

Comm. McLoughlin added that they are talking about two individuals who are adults and who are not here. Their parents are here discussing it.

Mr. Dowling stated he took issue with that and he thinks he deserves an apology.

Mrs. Varley stated she is speaking as a resident. A letter or phone call could have gone out.

Comm. McLoughlin stated he disagreed.

Mrs. Petti asked if there were any changes regarding family members who come down for the summer. Mayor McLaughlin stated that they are looking more closely at the applications, especially those who have family who do not live in Allenhurst, but have a New Jersey address and are placed on the application as residents.

Mrs. Petti stated her sister and her family li8ve in North Jersey, but actually come down and stay with her in the summer. They have always been considered residents.

Comm. Bolan stated there is always an opportunity for anyone to come before the Board to make their representations and have the Commissioners make their decisions on a case by case basis.

There being no further comments, public hearing was closed.

The Commissioners then spoke with Chic Perroto and Karen Marzulli regarding outside facilities for the summer season. Ms. Marzulli presented plans to the Commissioners regarding the layout of the outside kitchen, stating that they would be against the construction wall. Mr. Caron ad Chris Rogers joined the discussion.

There was some discussion regarding raising the tent.

Ms. Marzulli spoke about a storage room and Mr. Caron stated he has already spoken to Sonny Driscoll.

Ms. Marzulli gave a list of items for which she needs electric and Mr. Caron stated it will all depend on whether they have electric at the Club. They will not know until Thursday or Friday. If the box at poolside is working, they will have enough electric for everything. They will be limited to whatever the electrical inspector allows.

Ms. Marzulli asked about construction of the restaurant and Mayor McLaughlin stated they probably wouldn't allow any construction on the weekends.

Ms. Marzulli stated she would need a key to the Beach Club.

There being no further comments, public hearing was closed. As there was no further business, Comm. McLoughlin moved, seconded by Mayor McLaughlin, that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.
