**WHEREAS**, The wind and tidal surge associated with Hurricane Sandy has caused significant damage to the recreational beach facilities along the beachfront as well as beach protection structures along the entire Allenhurst oceanfront; and,

**WHEREAS**, As a result of this damage, FEMA has developed a plan to replenish the beaches along the coast of New Jersey from Sandy Hook to Cape May; and,

**WHEREAS**, It appears that the entire coast will be covered by a Federal Grant that should result in little or no cost to each municipality accepting this proposal; and,

**WHEREAS**, The preliminary proposal requires only public access to the beach every one-half mile of beach front and unrestricted parking in the area of beach access; and,

**WHEREAS**, Oceanfront property owners will have to grant access to the contractor to apply the sand and to beach visitors who wish to use this beach according to the rules that apply; and,

**WHEREAS**, The Board of Commissioners, after consulting with the Borough Engineer and Borough Attorney have decided that, subject to the final proposal for beach replenishment and an agreement with oceanfront property owners, they agree to commit to this program as required;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, By the Board of Commissioners, that a preliminary agreement be made, subject to a discussion with the oceanfront property owners, where applicable for the acceptance of beach replenishment.

WHEREAS, The recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including, but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and,

WHEREAS, A resolution authorizing Allenhurst Borough to apply for such tonnage grants for calendar year 2013, will memorialize the commitment of Allenhurst to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Board of Commissioners to the efforts undertaken by the Borough and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and,

WHEREAS, Such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** By the Board of Commissioners that they are hereby authorized to enter into closed session to discuss personnel matters which are exempt from the public meeting under the Sunshine Law.

#### VOTE: Comm. McLoughlin-AYE; Mayor McLaughlin-AYE PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED 2013 BUDGET

Ed Dowling stated there are all kinds of rumors floating around about FEMA. One of them is that they are saying anything below the tidal waters will not be covered.

Mayor McLaughlin explained that they have raised the flood plain. The DCA would not let the Borough build the bathrooms below that plain and they will have to be raised 23" to meet the new requirements.

Comm. McLoughlin added that the Borough has held rates flat this year as the won't know the budget impact until next year.

Lori Osborn, Borough Administrator, explained what they had heard regarding FEMA's determination and what they were doing to make sure the Borough would receive relief from FEMA.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor McLaughlin gave a status report on the many projects and their stages at the Allenhurst beach. The cabanas are currently being built and will begin to be moved to the beach in early May. He explained that the second set of steps at the north end of the beach will remain.

Kevin Reynold asked how raising the bathrooms would affect handicap access and Mayor McLaughlin explained that they would have to have ramps.

Mr. Dowling questioned sand replenishment and Mayor McLaughlin stated they have learned the sand will be coming directly off-shore. The State is requiring easements from all oceanfront property owners. They will start the replenishment project south and work their way up. The State has placed 1.8 billion dollars in the budget for this project. Deal, Loch Arbour and Allenhurst did not participate in the first replenishment project and they are being done as a separate group. They are hoping to be included in the Asbury Park portion of the project.

Al Walker asked if the Borough would be going forward with this and Mayor McLaughlin stated they just passed a resolution authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to sign the required easement.

There was a discussion concerning the replenishment I which Rick Henderson, a resident of West Allenhurst and a Beach Club member, stated Allenhurst was fortunate. He stated the beach replenishment has robbed Allenhurst of some value. The surfing community has been against this because they have not seen a profile or an analysis of the grain size. Since the last sand replenishment, the pool has never been the same. He would recommend forgetting the salt water pool and go with a fresh water pool. He has never seen the algae cleaned up. The last time the Corps came down, they took the "T" down. The normal sand drift comes from the south to the north. These are the largest beaches they have ever seen. Allenhurst would become a public beach. There is more flooding in Loch Arbour after the sand replenishment. They should at least try to get the Corps to extend the "L" jetty. Engineered beaches have suffered the worst damages.

Mayor McLaughlin thanked Mr. Hendrickson for his comments. He stated the jetties will not be notched. Mr. Hendrickson stated they should be extended and gave a history of the jetties in Allenhurst.

Richard Lees, Long Branch, stated he agreed with extending the groins. The DEP is telling everyone the replenishment will be to pre-Sandy conditions. He gave the Commissioners some technical data regarding replenishment, stating if they do this in the summer, there may be a precipitous drop-off. It also destroys the fishing habitat. There will also be silt with the sand. He stated the DEP may not fund this for Allenhurst at 100%. If the Borough has a 9' elevation, it could have unintended consequences.

Comm. McLoughlin stated they will be Phase III at best and may even be Phase IV.

Comm. McLoughlin stated Renosys will have the pool liner repaired by May 24<sup>th</sup>. Mr. C's will be running a snack bar at the Club. They are hoping to go out to bid on the restaurant and snack bar by July or August.

Ed. Dowling asked when the RFP's would go out for operation and Comm. McLoughlin stated after the construction bids, they will do the RFP's for operation.

Mayor McLaughlin commented that they will also put the reconstruction of the old snack bar building out to bid at the same time. Construction may occur on weekdays, but not on weekends.

Mr. Dowling asked about the new flood plain regulations and how it will affect rebuilding the restaurant. Mayor McLaughlin explained that the restaurant is above the flood plain, as is the old snack bar.

Mr. Moriarty asked about the layout of the bar and whether that would have to be raised. Mayor McLaughlin stated that the general thought, although this is very preliminary, was that the front half of the restaurant would be lower. It will have the same nautical theme and feel. They are still a long way from any decisions on design. The construction should take about a year.

Bob Scally asked if the Board would consider a BYO as opposed to a lessee with a liquor license. Mayor McLaughlin stated it was too early to say. Comm. McLoughlin stated they can get more rent from an establishment with a liquor license. Mayor McLaughlin commented that this will be a restaurant with a bar, not a bar with a restaurant.

Mrs. Petti asked if any progress had been made on cabana rules. Mayor McLaughlin replied, not yet, they are still working on it. They will try to have the rules by opening day. He urged everyone to e-mail any suggestions.

There being no further comments, the Commissioners adjourned to caucus and did not reconvene.
